- ↑ Magnetic Field Loss (Billions of Years): If Earth's core cools, it could lose its protective magnetic field, exposing the planet to radiation.
- ▲ Geological and Atmospheric Shifts (Millions to Billions of Years): Over time, shifting continents, volcanic activity, and atmospheric loss could alter Earth's habitability.
- 2 Human-Caused Extinction Risks
- Solution Climate Change (Decades to Centuries): Rising temperatures, sea levels, and extreme weather may threaten ecosystems and civilization.
- Nuclear War or Bioterrorism (Any Time): A global catastrophe could cause mass casualties or societal collapse.
- Al and Technological Risks (Decades to Centuries): Unregulated Al, genetic engineering, or nanotechnology could pose existential threats.
- Resource Depletion (Centuries to Millennia): Overuse of natural resources could destabilize the biosphere.
- 3 External Cosmic Threats
- Asteroid Impact (Any Time): A large asteroid strike, like the one that wiped out dinosaurs, could devastate humanity.
- Supernova or Gamma-Ray Burst (Millions of Years): A nearby cosmic explosion could strip away Earth's atmosphere.
- Alien Encounter (Unknown): If extraterrestrial life is hostile, it could pose a threat.
- Human Expansion Beyond Earth

Many scientists believe colonizing other planets is key to survival. 🖉 SpaceX, NASA, and others aim

to establish Moon and Mars bases within 50–100 years, with humans possibly settling on Mars within 100–200 years.

- Interstellar travel may be achievable in 500–1,000 years, expanding human life beyond Earth's fate.
- 5 A Biblical Perspective: Encouragement and Promise

Ecclesiastes 1:4 – "One generation passes away, and another comes: but the earth abides forever."
