- God's Spirit at Work—Inviting, Convicting, Restoring
- \*The heavens declare the glory of God..." (Psalm 19:1). Every sunrise, mountain peak, and crashing wave reflects His power, inviting us to open our hearts to His presence and beauty.
- God's law, written on every heart, gently pulls us toward truth—even when we resist (Romans 1:20). His Spirit works through our conscience, guiding us toward what is right and offering peace to those who listen.
- Scripture reveals God's heart and purpose, teaching us how to live with peace, joy, and meaning (2 Timothy 3:16). Each verse brings light to our path, offering hope in life's storms and wisdom to navigate the unknown.
- Through His life, death, and resurrection, Jesus carried our burdens and made the way back to God (John 1:14). His love frees us from fear, guilt, and shame, giving us the gift of life eternal.
- **©** God often speaks through life's pivotal moments—whether in storms or in stillness—just as He did with Elijah (1 Kings 19:12). Sometimes it's the quietest whispers that call us back to Him.
- Transformation is real—Saul became Paul, and God still changes hearts today (Acts 9:3-6). Every encounter with Christ is an invitation to new beginnings and a chance to become the person God intended you to be.
- \* The Spirit is Calling—But the Time is Now •

The Holy Spirit is at work now—comforting the weary, guiding seekers, and drawing us toward love and peace (John 16:8). But the Spirit will not strive with us forever (Genesis 6:3). God's mercy is vast, but it will not remain open indefinitely (Romans 2:5). Without Him, the joy, peace, and love we search for will eventually fade, leaving only emptiness and regret (2 Thessalonians 1:9).

- **†** Will You Accept Him?
- As believers, we walk between waiting with patience and pleading with urgency. Not everyone's time to believe has come. For some, it takes longer to recognize God's call, and we reflect His love patiently, just as God waits for all to come to repentance (2 Peter 3:9). This patience, however, does not diminish the urgency of the invitation. Love urges: Come now, while the door is still open!
- "The Spirit and the Bride say, 'Come!' And let the one who hears say, 'Come!' Let the one who is thirsty come; and let the one who wishes take the water of life without cost." (Revelation 22:17)

This moment is both a solemn warning and a joyful invitation. The warning is real—eternal separation from even a hint of God. But so is the invitation: a life filled with peace, purpose, and freedom. God's love offers a relationship that strengthens us today and secures the promise of joy

forever.

"If you declare, 'Jesus is Lord,' and believe in your heart that God raised Him from the dead, you will be saved." (Romans 10:9).
